Kim is a municipal sustainability expert with a proven record of successfully implementing sustainability frameworks and projects in several municipalities, including the cities of Victoria & Port Coquitlam. She is the Director of Sustainability for the City of Victoria and a full member of the Canadian Institute of Planners. Kim is also an appointed member of the Local Government Asset Management Working Group, the BC Brownfield Advisory Group and the Smart Growth BC Board. Her sustainability work has been published in *Leadership Makes a Difference*, *Going for Green*, the *Planning West* journal and *The Story of Brownfields and Smart Growth*.

Her design of the Sustainability Initiative for the City of Port Coquitlam integrated 12 land development activities from the corporate strategic level through budget and business planning to individual projects and applications. The Initiative won a Smart Growth BC award in 2006. She project managed the land sale of the Victoria Dockside lands, which were awarded the highest LEEDTM Platinum point total in the world (63 of a total of 70 points) for the first phase of development by the successful land sale developers. The Dockside Green project has won over 15 international to local sustainability awards.
